

CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

Chart 1. Current account

(in percent of GDP)




At the end of nine months of 2023, the current account balance was formed negative in the amount of USD 5,393.2 million (46.9 percent of GDP) under the influence of an increase in the trade deficit and deterioration in the balance of services.

TRADE BALANCE¹

Considerable growth in imports amid slight rise in export volumes conditioned enlargement in the trade deficit.

During nine months of 2023, the negative **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices totaled USD 6,174.0 million, having increased by 16.9 percent compared to nine months of 2022.

In the reporting period, the **foreign trade turnover** in FOB prices made USD 10,406.6 million, exceeding the comparable figure of 2022 by 28.5 percent.

In January-September 2023, **export of goods in FOB prices** constituted USD 2,116.3 million. Export of goods excluding gold came out at USD 1,496.6 million, having increased by 6.3 percent compared to the same period of 2022.

In the period under review, **import of goods in FOB prices** demonstrated growth by 24.0 percent compared to nine months of 2022 and figured up to USD 8,290.3 million.

STRUCTURE OF FOREIGN TRADE²

Export of goods in FOB prices, excluding the National Bank's adjustments in accordance with the balance of payments methodology, was equal to USD 2,115.7 million. Exports excluding gold came up to USD 1,496.0 million, having grown by 6.2 percent compared to the same period of 2022.

During nine months of 2023, the products of industrial sector and agriculture were the basis of the commodity structure of export.

During the period considered, the volume of production of base metals and manufactured metal articles fell by 11.8 percent because of a reduction in the production of non-ferrous metals by 13.2 percent³. Whereas, in January-September 2023, export of gold reached USD 619.7 million.

Moreover, there was growth in the export of ore and precious metals concentrates (by USD 38.6 million). However, there was a reduction in the export of non-ferrous base metal waste and scrap (by USD 8.5 million). The fluctuations in the value of these items were conditioned by changes in the physical volume and the average prices of supplies.

According to the NSC KR, in January-September 2023, slight growth in gross output of agricultural products resulted from rise in crop production⁴. In addition, there was a reduction in the supplies of vegetables (by USD 40.5 million), fruits (by USD 17.6 million) and live animals (by USD 6.1 million) among the large commodity items. Moreover, there was advancement in the supplies of cereal preparations and preparations of flour or starch (by USD 2.9 million), as well as fish (by USD 3.2 million).

In January-September 2023, there was an increase in the volume of production output of textile, clothes and footwear, leather and other leather articles by 33.7 percent owing to expansion in clothes output by 1.5 times⁵. Despite this, export of the main products of garment production decreased by 55.8 percent and totaled USD 82.1 million. A decrease was largely conditioned by fall in export on the items such as “articles of apparel made of textile fabrics, knitted or non-knitted” (by USD 30.1 million), “clothing accessories, knitted or non-knitted, crocheted or non-crocheted” (by USD 14.4 million) and “garments, knitted or crocheted for women and girls” (by USD 8.3 million). Changes in other commodity items had slight impact on the export of garment goods.

The share of the non-EAEU countries prevailed **in the geographical structure of exports** compared to nine months of 2022 (56.3 percent). In the monitored period, the largest volume of goods exports was directed to Switzerland, Uzbekistan, and the UAE (in total, the share made 71.0 percent among the non-EAEU countries), goods of processing industry (gold) and agricultural products were generally supplied to these countries.

The aggregate share of the EAEU countries in the total export of goods constituted 43.7 percent respectively. The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mainly represented by the products of light industry and agriculture. Almost the entire volume of these goods was supplied to Russia (60.3 percent) and Kazakhstan (37.9 percent).

Following the results of nine months of 2023, **import of goods** in CIF prices went up by 22.6 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and reached USD 8,752.4 million.

In January-September 2023, the total value of import of goods of the SITC largest group – “machinery and transport equipment” – advanced by 2.8 times and came out at USD 4,503.3 million. In the commodity structure of the aforementioned group, the serious increase was observed in supplies on the items “motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of people” (by USD 1,395.8 million), “parts of equipment for production machinery” (by USD 732.2 million) and “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 54.5 million).

Besides, there was a decrease in imports only on one item “sewing-machine needles; furniture, parts for the machines and furniture” (by USD 50.0 million).

During the period covered by the report, import of goods of the group “manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” went down by 27.6 percent and constituted USD 1,456.1 million. The items such as “locksmith’s equipment, safes and hardware” (by USD 169.2 million), “knitted or crocheted fabrics” (by USD 101.0 million) and “fabrics, woven, of man-made textile materials” (by USD 140.7 million) demonstrated substantial decline. Furthermore, there was an advancement in import of “articles of paper, paperboard, not included in other categories” (by USD 5.8 million).

During nine months of 2023, import of commodity items of the section “mineral fuel, lubricants and oils” fell by 22.6 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and totaled USD 651.1 million. The petroleum products had a considerable share in the commodity structure of imports in this group. During the period considered, the value of imported petroleum products dropped by 26.5 percent and made USD 522.1 million. There was a reduction in the supplies of gasoline (by USD 90.5 million) and gas oil (by USD 120.5 million). Besides, there was rise in supplies of lubricants by USD 10.2 million and other petroleum products – by USD 14.5 million.

During the period under review, import of goods of the group “miscellaneous manufactured articles” fell by 45.1 percent and constituted USD 657.9 million. Decrease in value was largely conditioned by the reduction in imports on the items “footwear” and “articles of apparel and clothing accessories”, the value of supplies thereof went down by USD 181.8 and 245.8 million, respectively. Other commodity items of the group showed insignificant changes in the value of supplies.

During the period considered, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries fell down to 24.9 percent (during nine months of 2022, 34.3 percent) in the geographical structure of imports. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan, prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. A wide range of consumer and investment goods, besides energy carriers, are also imported from these countries.

Summarizing the results of nine months of 2023, the share of the non-EAEU countries advanced significantly compared to the same period in 2022 (65.7 percent) and came up to 75.1 percent. The upward dynamics of import from third countries was normally caused by expansion in the supplies of intermediate and consumer goods. China remains the largest trading partner of the Kyrgyz Republic with the share of 56.3 percent of total imports from the non-EAEU countries. In January-September 2023, goods were also supplied from the Republic of Korea (6.1 percent), Türkiye (5.3 percent), the USA (4.8 percent) and Germany (4.6 percent).



BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The negative balance of the international services increased, being conditioned by outstripping growth in import of services compared to export thereof.

At the end of the reporting period, the **balance of international services** was formed negative equal to the amount of USD 441.6 million, having increased by 3.6 times compared to nine months of 2022. This dynamics was conditioned by growth in the import of services by 83.5 percent, up to USD 1,919.3 million, while the export of services rose by 59.9 percent and totaled USD 1,477.7 million.

During the monitored period, as before, the defining items of services were “travels” and “transport services”, which in total constituted 71.4 percent of the turnover of international services.

During the period considered, the balance of transport services was traditionally formed negative and reached 587.4 million USD, having increased by 55.0 percent compared to the same period in 2022. This trend was conditioned by more significant growth of import of transport services compared to their exports: imports went up by USD 237.6 million or 37.0 percent, basically owing to railway transport services, whereas exports upsized by USD 29.2 million or 11.1 percent, generally because of air and automobile transport services.

The balance of the item “travels” was formed positive being equal to USD 407.7 million, having advanced by 19.4 percent compared to nine months of 2022. In the period under review, the total volume of services related to the trips of the citizens of the foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic (travel exports) rose by 64.0 percent and made USD 832.3 million. This growth was predominantly conditioned by enhancement in the tourist flow particularly from the neighboring countries. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) went up by 2.6 times and totaled USD 424.6 million.

The balance of the item “personal, cultural and recreational services” was formed negative and constituted USD 203.6 million, having risen by 2.9 times compared to the same period of 2022. An increase of the negative balance of this item was conditioned by growth in imports by 3.0 times, up to USD 358.5 million, while exports showed slight growth – up to USD 154.9 million (by 3.0 times).

BALANCE OF PRIMARY INCOME

Dynamics of the item “primary income” in the period under review was chiefly defined by the change in the volume of non-residents’ income received on direct investments.

Based on the results of nine months of 2023, the balance of the item “**primary income**” was formed negative in the sum of USD 412.0 million, having fallen by 19.4 percent compared to the same indicator in January-September 2022. This dynamics was largely conditioned by reduction down to USD 339.0 million in the volume of resident companies’ reinvested income received by the foreign investors. The volume of accrued dividends payable decreased by 15.3 percent and was equal to USD 38.1 million. As a result, the balance of investment income on direct investments was formed negative with USD 380.2 million, having declined by 9.9 percent compared to the level of income payable for nine months of 2022.

The volume of accrued interest payable on other investments of the public and private sectors totaled USD 95.0 million. Interest receivable on other investments corresponded to USD 64.9 million. As a result, the net volume of accrued interest payable on the item “other investments” went down by 63.2 percent compared to nine months of 2022 and made USD 30.1 million.

During the period covered by the report, the balance of the item “labor remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 1.7 million and fell by 76.2 percent as a result of a reduction in the total volume of income of the non-residents from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

BALANCE OF SECONDARY INCOME

Cut-down in net inflow of private sector transfers had a determining influence on the item “secondary income”.

At the end of nine months of 2023, positive balance of secondary income constituted USD 1,634.4 million, having gone down by 4.5 percent through a decline by 3.2 percent in private transfer receipts, down to USD 1,637.4 million.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, almost the entire volume of receipts was provided by money transfers of individuals. During the monitored period, the gross inflow of money transfers declined by 17.1 percent, and outflow came down by 48.1 percent. As a result, the net inflow fell by 2.4 percent compared to the same period of 2022 and reached USD 1,629.5 million.



Money transfer systems⁶ remain the main mode of remittances to the country, which provide 70.5 percent of all individuals' remittances to the country. However, the share thereof decreased by 19.4 percentage points compared to the same period of 2022. A decrease in the share was conditioned by significant growth of remittances through the bank mobile applications (bank cards) and e-wallets (the share in the total remittances inflow increased from 4.3 percent in January-September 2022 up to 24.2 percent in January-September 2023).

Thus, at the end of nine months of 2023, the gross volume of funds received through the money transfer systems was reduced by 35.0 percent compared to 2022 and constituted USD 1,437.6 million⁷. The volume of remittances outflow from the country also declined and totaled USD 360.1 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the money transfer systems fell by 24.8 percent and made USD 1,077.5 million.

In January-September 2023, gross funds received through the bank mobile applications (bank cards) and e-wallets grew by 4.7 times compared to the same period of 2022 and amounted to USD 494.6 million. The volume of remittances outflow from the country increased by 3.9 times and totaled USD 50.8 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the bank mobile applications (bank cards) and e-wallets increased by 4.8 times and amounted to USD 443.9 million. The share of postal transfers remains insignificant.

The geographic structure of remittances remains unchanged. At the end of the reporting period, the main share of remittances was received from the Russian Federation (93.1 percent). In the structure of remittances forwarded from the Kyrgyz Republic, the weighty share also falls on the Russian Federation (83.9 percent).

Regarding the results of nine months of 2023, net inflow of remittances assessed as USD 1,629.5 million was insufficient to cover net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value in the volume of USD 2,162.6 million.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the capital account was formed positive to a large extent as a consequence of the capital transfers inflow.


On the back of the results of the first nine months of 2023, the capital account was formed with a positive balance equal to USD 148.7 million thanks to net inflows of public sector's capital transfers for USD 125.1 million from abroad.

FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the financial account was formed negative first of all owing to the dynamics of direct investments.

At the end of nine months of 2023, net borrowing from the rest of the world, presented in the financial account (analytical representation of the balance of payments), totaled USD 130.9 million, however in the same period of 2022, there was net borrowing equal to USD 600.1 million. In the period considered, the financial account, as before, experienced major impact of the items "direct investments" and "other investments".

During the first nine months of 2023, foreign economic transactions on the item "other investments" provided net lending to the rest of the world for USD 262.8 million, in the same

period of 2022 – USD 269.8 million. In the period under review, the dynamics of other investments was mainly determined by the net purchase of financial assets. Thus, the assets of residents outside the Kyrgyz Republic went up by USD 321.8 million (in January-September 2022, assets increased by USD 694.3 million) mainly due to an increase in the total volume of cash currency and deposits of the resident banks abroad in the amount of USD 292.0 million. The trade credits and advances of private sector also grew by USD 28.3 million. As of the end of September 2023, the prevailing volume of enterprises' accounts receivable fell on the wholesale and retail trade, processing industry, as well as institutions engaged in the professional, scientific and technical activity.

During the period under consideration, net incurrence of liabilities being equal to USD 59.1 million was principally a result of growth in liabilities on loans and borrowings of all sectors of the economy by USD 97.1 million amid a decrease by USD 45.8 million in liabilities on trade credits and advances of other sectors (during the first nine months of 2022, liabilities on trade credits and advances increased by USD 127.8 million), basically because of the excess of payments on the principal amount of debt over the volume of credits received by other sectors.

During the period considered, the negative balance on direct investments amounted to USD 402.9 million (net borrowing), which was predominantly conditioned by growth in net incurrence of liabilities by the residents assessed as USD 404.5 million through receipt of reinvested earnings in the sum of USD 339.0 million.

In the sectoral structure, the main volume of foreign direct investment was forwarded to the enterprises of processing industries (net inflow – USD 96.6 million), wholesale and retail trade (USD 99.3 million), financial intermediation and insurance (USD 75.0 million), as well as mining (USD 72.9 million). However, there was net outflow from the sectors engaged in provision (supply) of electricity, gas, steam and conditioned air (USD 28.5 million), as well as arts, entertainment and recreation (USD 3.9 million).

CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

The balance of the item “errors and omissions” was formed positive in the volume of USD 4,753.0 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of nine months of 2023 constituted USD 2,629.5 million, which covers 2.4 months⁸ of future imports of goods and services.


Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices
