
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CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

(in percent of GDP)




At the end of Q1 2024, the current account balance was formed negative in the amount of USD 2,237.7 million (52.5 percent of GDP) under the influence of an increase in the trade deficit and deterioration in the balance of services and primary income.

TRADE BALANCE¹

Considerable growth in imports amid slight rise in export volumes conditioned enlargement in the trade deficit.

In Q1 2024, the negative **trade balance** of the Kyrgyz Republic in FOB prices totaled USD 2,493.4 million, having grown by 38.3 percent compared to the same period of 2023.

In the reporting period, the **foreign trade turnover** in FOB prices made USD 3,511.4 million, exceeding the comparable figure of Q1 2023 by 29.7 percent.

Export of goods in FOB prices constituted USD 509.0 million. Export of goods excluding gold came out at USD 369.3 million, having decreased by 8.0 percent compared to the same period of 2023.

Import of goods in FOB prices demonstrated growth by 33.2 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and figured up at USD 3,002.4 million.

STRUCTURE OF FOREIGN TRADE²

Export of goods in FOB prices increased by 12.8 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023, to make USD 510.9 million. Exports excluding gold decreased by 7.8 percent compared to Q1 2023, down to USD 371.2 million.

At the end of Q1 2024, the products of industrial sector and agriculture were the basis of the commodity structure of export.

During the period considered, there was a reduction in the production of non-ferrous metals (by 1.7 percent)³. Whereas, in January-March 2024, export of gold increased by 2.8 times compared to Q1 2023 and totaled USD 139.7 million.

Moreover, during the period under review, there was growth in the articles of iron or steel not included in other categories (by USD 8.7 million). However, there was a reduction in the export of ore and precious metals concentrates (by USD 20.2 million). The fluctuations in the value of these items were conditioned by changes in the physical volume and the average prices of supplies.

According to the NSC KR, at the end of Q1 2024, growth in gross output of agricultural products resulted from rise in production output of livestock sector⁴. There was an increase in the supplies of live animals (by USD 4.3 million). In crop production, there was advancement in the supplies of fruits and nuts (by USD 3.7 million), however, among large commodity items there was a reduction in the supplies of vegetables (by USD 3.9 million), cereal preparations and preparations of flour or starch (by USD 2.8 million).

In Q1 2024, there was an increase in the volume of production output of textile, clothes and footwear, leather and other leather articles by 12.8 percent owing to expansion in clothes output (by 16.9 percent)⁵. Despite this, export of the main products of garment production decreased by 40.3 percent and totaled USD 15.6 million. A decrease was largely conditioned by fall in exports on the items such as “garments made of textile fabrics for women and girls” (by USD 3.1 million), “garments, knitted or crocheted for women and girls” (by USD 2.4 million) and “articles of apparel made of textile fabrics, knitted or non-knitted” (by USD 1.3 million). Changes in other commodity items had slight impact on the export of garment goods.

The share of the non-EAEU countries prevailed in the geographic structure of exports (61.6 percent) compared to the same period of 2023. In the monitored period, the largest volume of goods exports was sent to Switzerland, Uzbekistan, Türkiye and the UAE (in total, the share made 56.9 percent among the non-EAEU countries), goods of processing industry (gold) and agricultural products were generally supplied to these countries.

The aggregate share of the EAEU countries in the total export of goods constituted 38.4 percent respectively. The commodity structure of exports to the EAEU countries is mainly represented by the products of light industry and agriculture. Almost the entire volume of these goods was supplied to Russia (60.5 percent) and Kazakhstan (36.5 percent).

In Q1 2024, **import of goods** in CIF prices went up by 33.1 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023 and reached USD 3,214.6 million.

In the reporting period, the total value of import of goods of the SITC largest group – “machinery and transport equipment” – advanced by 2.2 times and came out at USD 2,013.4 million. In the commodity structure of the aforementioned group, the serious increase was observed in supplies on the items “motor cars and other motor vehicles principally designed for the transport of people” (by USD 585.3 million), “parts of equipment for production machinery” (by USD 452.1 million) and “parts of harvesting machines and machines for sorting eggs, fruits, seeds, grain” (by USD 40.4 million).

Besides, there was a decrease in imports on the item “electrical apparatus for line telephony or line telegraphy” (by USD 20.3 million).

According to the results of Q1 2024, the volume of import of goods of the group “manufactured goods classified chiefly by material” fell by 45.6 percent and figured up at USD 346.6 million. The items such as “knitted or crocheted fabrics” (by USD 232.9 million) and “locksmith’s equipment, safes and hardware” (by USD 66.6 million) demonstrated substantial decline. Furthermore, there was an increase in imports on the items “iron and steel” and “curtains and other household furnishings made of textile materials” by USD 19.7 million and USD 11.8 million, respectively.

In Q1 2024, import of commodity items of the section “mineral fuel, lubricants and oils” increased by 58.8 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023 and totaled USD 259.8 million. The petroleum products had a considerable share in the commodity structure of imports in this group. During the period considered, the value of imported petroleum products grew by 85.6 percent and made USD 182.2 million. There was rise in the supplies of gas oil (by USD 52.2 million), gasoline (by USD 24.2 million) and kerosene (by USD 8.9 million). At the same time, there was a reduction in supplies of lubricants by USD 2.7 million and other petroleum products – by USD 0.9 million.

During the period under review, import of goods of the group “miscellaneous manufactured articles” fell by 16.2 percent and constituted USD 171.9 million. Decrease in value was largely conditioned by the reduction in imports on the items “footwear”, the value of supplies thereof went down by USD 56.8 million, respectively. There was an increase in imports by USD 18.5 million on the item “articles of apparel and clothing accessories”, meanwhile other commodity items of the group demonstrated insignificant change in the value of supplies

During the period considered, the share of supplies from the EAEU countries fell down to 21.1 percent (at the end of Q1 2023, 28.1 percent) **in the geographic structure of imports**. Fuel and energy products, the bulk of which is supplied from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Kazakhstan, prevail in the commodity structure of imports from the EAEU countries. A wide range of consumer and investment goods, besides energy carriers, are also imported from these countries.

In Q1 2024, the share of the non-EAEU countries advanced significantly compared to the same indicator in 2023 (71.9 percent) and came up at 78.9 percent. The upward dynamics of imports from third countries was normally caused by expansion in the supplies of intermediate and consumer goods. China remains the largest trading partner with the share of 63.6 percent of total imports from the non-EAEU countries. In January-March 2024, goods were also supplied from Germany (4.3 percent), Türkiye (4.1 percent), the USA (3.6 percent) and Uzbekistan (3.6 percent).



BALANCE OF INTERNATIONAL SERVICES

The negative balance of the international services increased, being conditioned by outstripping growth in import of services compared to export thereof.

At the end of the reporting period, the **balance of international services** was formed negative equal to the amount of USD 181.7 million, having increased by 6.5 times compared to the same indicator of 2023. The export of services grew by 30.6 percent and figured up at USD 658.1 million, while the import of services rose by 58.0 percent, up to USD 839.8 million.

During the monitored period, as before, the determining items of services were “transport services”, “travels” and “personal, cultural and recreational services”, which in total constituted 77.6 percent of the overall turnover of international services.

During the period considered, the balance of transport services was traditionally formed negative and reached USD 230.4 million, having increased by 78.7 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023. This trend was conditioned by growth of import of transport services compared to their exports: imports went up by USD 92.4 million or 38.4 percent, basically owing to railway and automobile transport services, whereas exports fell by USD 9.0 million or 8.1 percent, respectively, generally because of a reduction in the services provided by other types of transport.

The balance of the item “travels” was formed positive in the amount of USD 80.3 million, having decreased by 48.0 percent compared to Q1 2023 (due to reduction in exports growth on the item “travels”). In the period under review, the total volume of services related to the trips of the citizens from the foreign countries to the Kyrgyz Republic (travel exports) decreased by 23.3 percent and made USD 233.5 million. This decline was predominantly conditioned by reduction in the tourist flow mainly from the neighboring countries. The volume of services rendered to the residents during their stay abroad (travel imports) went up insignificantly by 2.0 percent and amounted to USD 153.2 million.

The balance of the item “personal, cultural and recreational services” was formed positive and constituted USD 2.9 million (against a negative balance of USD 49.5 million in Q1 2023). Growth on this item was observed in both directions – exports and imports, which was a result of an increase in demand for received and provided services to the individuals, as well as the services in the sphere of culture and recreation. Thus, compared to the same indicator of 2023, the positive balance of the said item was conditioned by the growth of its imports by 2.2 times, up to USD 168.3 million, while its exports grew more markedly – up to USD 171.2 million, i.e. by 6.5 times.

BALANCE OF PRIMARY INCOME

Dynamics of the item “primary income” in the period under review was largely formed under the influence of a significant growth in the volume of payments on investment income to non-residents.

Based on the results of Q1 2024, the balance of the item “**primary income**” was formed negative in the sum of USD 151.0 million, having grown by 31.1 percent compared to the same indicator of 2023. This dynamics largely conditioned by rise by 32.7 percent, up to USD 178.6 million, in payments by the resident companies on investment income to the foreign investors. The volume of accrued dividends receivable by the residents increased by 41.0 percent and amounted to USD 28.3 million. As a result, the balance of investment income from direct investments was formed negative in the amount of USD 126.6 million, having increased by 24.0 percent compared to the level of income payable in Q1 2023.

The volume of accrued interest payable on other investments of the public and private sectors totaled USD 52.0 million. Interest receivable on other investments corresponded to USD 28.3 million. As a result, net accrued interest payable on the item “other investments” was formed negative at USD 23.8 million, having increased by 91.0 percent compared to the same indicator in 2023.

During the period covered by the report, the balance of the item “labor remuneration” was formed negative in the amount of USD 0.7 million and came up by 6.3 percent as a result of insignificant increase in the total volume of non-residents’ income from labor activity in the Kyrgyz Republic.

BALANCE OF SECONDARY INCOME

Increase of net inflow of private sector transfers had a determining influence on the item “secondary income”.

According to the results of Q1 2024, positive balance of **secondary income** constituted USD 588.4 million, having increased by 20.7 percent due to growth by 20.5 percent in private sector transfer receipts, up to USD 588.5 million.

In the structure of private transfers, as before, almost the whole volume of receipts was provided at the expense of inflow of money resources on the item “workers’ remittances”. In the reporting period, the gross inflow of money transfers increased by 12.8 percent, however, outflow of money transfers decreased by 12.5 percent. As a result, the net inflow increased by 21.2 percent compared to Q1 2023 and totaled USD 587.0 million.



Money transfer systems⁶ remain the main mode of remittances into the country, which provide more than 59.6 percent of all remittances coming through them (there was a decrease in share from 72.5 percent compared to the end of Q1 2023). In Q1 2024, the gross volume of funds received through the money transfer systems were reduced by 7.3 percent compared to the same period in 2023 and constituted USD 433.7 million⁷. The volume of remittances outflow from the country also declined and totaled USD 67.9 million. As a result, the net inflow of individuals' remittances through the money

transfer systems grew by 14.9 percent and made USD 365.8 million. In this context, there was a significant growth by 77.3 percent in the total volume of remittances through the bank mobile applications (bank cards) and e-wallets (the share in the total inflow of all remittances constitutes about 35.4 percent). The share of postal transfers, as before, remains insignificant.

The geographic structure of remittances remains unchanged. As of the end of the reporting period, the main share of remittances was received from the Russian Federation (93.0 percent). In the structure of remittances forwarded from the Kyrgyz Republic, the weighty share also falls on the Russian Federation (90.8 percent).

Regarding the results of Q1 2024, net inflow of labor migrants' remittances assessed as USD 587.0 million was insufficient to cover net export of consumer goods, which, in turn, was formed with a negative value in the volume of USD 864.2 million.

CAPITAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the capital account was formed positive mainly due to the inflow of capital transfers.


In Q1 2024, **the capital account** was formed with a positive balance in the amount of USD 35.7 million mainly due to net inflows of public sector's capital transfers in the amount of USD 30.0 million from abroad.

FINANCIAL ACCOUNT

The balance of the financial account was formed negative mainly due to the dynamics of direct investments.

According to the results of Q1 2024, net borrowing from the rest of the world presented in the financial account (analytical presentation of the balance of payments) totaled USD 6.6 million, meanwhile in the same period of 2023, net lending amounted to USD 125.0 million. In the reporting period, as before, the financial account experienced major impact of direct and other investments.

In Q1 2024, the foreign economic operations on the item "other investments" provided net lending to the rest of the world in the amount of USD 94.8 million, however, in Q1 2023, net lending to the rest of the world for the same indicator totaled USD 192.5 million. In the reporting period, the dynamics of other investments was primarily conditioned by net acquisition of financial assets. Growth of residents' assets outside the Kyrgyz Republic by USD 135.7 million (at the end of the same period of 2023, assets increased by USD 24.0 million) was provided by an increase in the total volume of cash currency and deposits of the resident banks abroad in the amount of USD 171.4 million. Trade credits and advances to the private sector decreased by USD 43.8 million. At the end of Q1 2024, the prevailing volume of enterprises' accounts receivable fell on the spheres of transport activities and storage of goods, manufacturing enterprises, wholesale and retail trade, as well as financial intermediation and insurance.

During the period under review, net incurrence of liabilities was formed positive in the amount of USD 40.9 million resulted mainly from an increase of liabilities of the commercial banks on cash currencies and deposits on foreign accounts by USD 70.6 million, as well as on loans and borrowings of all sectors of economy by USD 16.3 million. In addition, liabilities on trade credits and advances to other sectors of the economy decreased by USD 46.0 million (in Q1 2023, liabilities on trade credits and advances decreased by USD 171.4 million).

In Q1 2024, negative balance on direct investment constituted USD 101.5 million (net borrowing), which was mainly due to an increase in net incurrence of liabilities by the residents in the amount of USD 100.2 million due to the inflow of reinvested income totaling USD 114.4 million.

In the context of sectors, direct foreign investments were primarily forwarded to the manufacturing enterprises (net inflow – USD 58.2 million), information and communication (USD 17.3 million), wholesale and retail trade (USD 15.7 million), as well as construction (USD 8.1 million). At the same time, there was net outflow from the sectors of professional, scientific and technical activities (USD 8.0 million), financial intermediation and insurance (USD 4.0 million) and mining (USD 3.1 million).

CURRENT STATUS OF THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS

The balance of the item “errors and omissions” was formed positive in the amount of USD 2,158.4 million. The volume of gross international reserves at the end of Q1 2024 amounted to USD 3,491.2 million, which covers 3.4 months⁸ of future import of goods and services.


Chart I.1. Nominal and Real Effective Exchange Rate Indices
